

# IN MEMORIAM MS. DOROTHY STEVENS



Dorothy Welthin Stevens was born October 1, 1940 in Swainby, England to Gilbert Gledden Armstrong and Evelyn Gertrude Mary Armstrong (née Morton). She grew up in Eaglescliffe, attended Queen Victoria High School in Stockton -on-Tees, and got her first degree from Derby Teacher's College outside Nottingham. Dorothy came to the United States in 1964 to have some "adventures," working as a private special education school teacher, governess, and at the British Consulate for several years in the Chicagoland area, traveling and hiking throughout the country, and taking up folk dancing where she met her husband, Charlie Stevens. They were married on October 11, 1969 in Minneapolis.

Dorothy completed her US teaching degree through College of DuPage and North Central College while raising her children. She eventually took a full time kindergarten position in Goodrich School in Woodridge where she worked until her retirement in 2004. She developed many of her own curricula materials, particularly Math in Motion, a hands-on early childhood teaching method. Dorothy was fascinated by and insightful about the potential of young children her whole life.

Dorothy took great pride in and care of her garden at her home on 75th Street, sharing plants with friends and teaching many about different plant names. She also set up a craft and art studio in her basement, pursuing many different activities. She found her greatest joy in painting which she did with the Naperville Art League for many years until shortly before her death. Dorothy loved to travel and hiked through natural areas on all her trips across the US and around the world. She returned to England many times on her own and with her family, instilling in her children a continuing love of her homeland and connection to important family and friends there. She loved to see what young people were capable of, to find homemade solutions for problems, and to be aware of the latest news. She loved nature and art and instilled a love of these things in her children and grandchildren. She had a natural enthusiasm for swimming, conservation, and family history.

Dorothy died on December 24, 2023 in Naperville, Illinois from complications of gallbladder cancer. On learning of her diagnosis, she said there was nothing else she felt she needed to do, and she wanted to spend as much time with her children and grandchildren as possible. Brett and Hanna are so happy to have been able to be with her these past few months, sharing special and everyday moments with her and her large network of dedicated friends. She is survived by her sister, Sylvia, her son, Brett (Joelle Mader), daughter Hanna (Gordon Buchanan), and granddaughters Greta, Wendy, and Emily. A memorial service will be held in May 2024 at the DuPage Unitarian Universalist Church at 1828 Old Naperville Rd, Naperville, IL and Dorothy and her husband Charlie's remains will be interred in the Naperville Cemetery columbarium.
