BOARD NOTES

- Public Art Competition: The "Grounds for Potential" show was well received. There were 43 entries. Photos were taken and are being sent to Loaves and Fishes to be made into

- Classroom Renovation Phase I: Sink room will be almost complete on Wed. of this week. and the shelves will be restocked in time for the Casino Night event on Sat. Final approval of the job will be scheduled with the builder soon. SECA Grants should be announced April 15, and we have been recommended to receive money for flooring.
- Board meetings will now take place the first Tuesday of each month at 6:30pm. An agenda will be posted on the website at least one week ahead.
- We were selected to host the Ice Cream Social again this year on July 10. We will look

for a chairperson to head up this endeavor. Food served must be "cooked in an approved kitchen," meaning no homemade items. Supplies and equipment from last year that can be used.

- Member Kim Yench was approved for the Saturday desk position and will be contacted to start on April 19.
- Board Election:- There are several candidates for some open board positions and too few for other positions. Overall response has been good and a final slate will be ready soon.
- Casino Royale: Many volunteers signed up to help with the event. We have a large selection of donated items, plus 6 posters and two standing figures for the raffle. There will also be a 50/50 raffle. Guests will buy drink tickets and chips at the entry. There will be two gaming tables in the gallery and three in the classroom. So far 80 people have signed up on line, and many walk-ins are expected.
