Items must be received by the end of the month in order to appear in the next month's newsletter and are accepted on a first come, first served basis as space is limited.

The call for artists is now for NAL's Public Art Competition. This year, NAL is partnering with Loaves & Fishes Community Pantry for our competition open to anyone high school age and above. All art must be the artist's personal, original interpretation of the theme,

"Transition." Cash prizes will be awarded for Best of Show and Awards of Excellence. Merit awards receive ribbons. Art (with permission) may be published on Loaves & Fishes note cards with all proceeds going to Loaves & Fishes Community Services.

Award reception will be held Sun., Mar. 15 from 2:00 to 4:00 pm at the Naperville Fine Art Center & Gallery, 508 N. Center St, Naperville. Exhibit runs from Mar. 11 - Mar. 21. An entry form is available at the Gallery or online at napervilleartleague.com. Here are some key points:

- NAL membership is not required to participate.
- Competition is open to high school students, college students and adults.
- · Work must be original in concept and execu-

tion and made within the last 3 years.

- Entry form and artist's statement explaining how piece relates to theme (max. 100 words) must accompany art.
- 2D or 3D art in any media is acceptable.
- Maximum size for 2D is 36" x 48" for outside frame edges. Must have a wire hanger.
- Maximum size for 3D is 48" high by 36" wide, weighing no more than 100 lbs. Must be free-standing and ready to display.
- Entry fee \$15; \$10 for NAL members.
- NAL reserves the right to refuse any piece.
- Entry deadline is Feb. 21.
- All work must be picked up within one week following the closing of the exhibit. Pieces not picked up by April 4, 2015 become the property of NAL.

The Gallery of Gifts holiday show report will be in next month's newsletter. This year's NAL revenue exceeded last year's, which means collectively the artists did well. Thanks to the many volunteers who made the event a success!

Thanks also to the NAL teachers who brought in art for the Give the Gift of a Class show at the end of 2014. More emphasis is being placed on lining up and promoting classes.

"Shortcuts," our next member show runs from January 14 to 31. Also mark your calendar for the Jan. 23 Fourth Friday evening social gathering.

Fabulous Fakes is the theme for the February 4-28 member show. Do your own interpretation of another artist's work. Consider adding a clever twist or working in a different medium. You could also do an original in another artist's style. This popular, annual show draws many visitors and the attention of the media. Drop off is Jan. 29-31. This is the one show where you must adhere to the theme. See below for other rules. Artists/awards reception is February 8 from 2:00 to 4:00 pm.

Fabulous Fakes Rules: * Submitted work must adhere to theme. * Your piece does not have to

be for sale. * Exact copies may not be for sale unless the original artist has been dead for 70 years or longer and you can verify the original is no longer protected under copyright agreements. * Submit a printed image of the original with your art. This will go in the judge's referral notebook. Be sure to include the name of the original artist and title of the original work.

The annual Public Art Competition is on the horizon. Themed "Transition," this contest is open to the public and cash prizes will be awarded. Rules are in the information flyer which is available on line or at the Gallery. Deadline is February 21 and the show runs March 11-21 with the awards reception on Sunday, March 15 from 2:00 to 4:00 pm. We are again partnering with Loaves & Fishes Community Services to promote the event and the services our organizations provide. A nonperishable food drive is part of the plan. This is an opportunity to introduce artist friends to NAL so please help promote it.

Future show theme: the late March/April member show will be themed Encounters.

Art Auction planning is beginning. If you would like to serve on the committee, please contact Debbie at the Gallery asap. Tentative date for the fundraiser is the end of April. We will also be asking for donations of art items.

As you plan 2015, consider subscribing to a gallery page on NAL's website. For only \$25 your information will be readily accessible to art enthusiasts. For artists who already have their own website, this provides another point of visibility and a link to your site.
