PRESIDENT'S CORNER

Dear Members and Friends.

As my presidential duties comes to a close, I'm looking at some of the great work we've done in the past year as well as where we are. We continue to work for growth in instruction and education while keeping focus on what works. We sought new opportunities for the membership in the community by offering popular classes in a variety of media in various time-slots. We recognized the growing trend toward shorter time commitments and are responding to a world where social media is an effective way to communicate.

Facebook, Twitter, Pinterest and Meet-Up are all being used successfully to share who we are and to invite attention. We have also been able to respond to requests for high caliber artists and workshops. Acclaimed artists John Walker, Lisa Ober, and, Nolan McCants were all presenters at NAL.

We have been connecting with the community. We collaborated with Loaves and Fishes for the public art competition and welcomed Frank Tumino, an administrator at Little City, to share his exceptional documentary "Share My Kingdom," a film that showcases the artistic lives of three mentally disabled artists. We have a number of members that share their time and talent regularly with other nonprofits such as WSDRA, Literacy DuPage and Little Friends. Whenever asked, I have created special art classes for groups with unique needs. We've also hosted many Brownies, Girl Scouts, and Boy Scouts. We continue to collaborate with Indie bound, supporting other members in the organization. We were happy to welcome Nickel-A-Day Films to our gallery

and classroom where they filmed a portion of their soon-to-be released project.

Tending to what works is at least as important as finding new things to embrace. Fourth Fridays is always well attended — good music, refreshments, outstanding atmosphere and time for visiting with art friends and neighbors in a winning event. There are gallery shows that are worth repeating. Among these are: the Cats Guardians event in January, the annual public art competition, the Fiber Divas exhibit, our Holiday Show in November and December, and of course, our signature event — the Riverwalk Fine Art Fair in September.

Finally, a critically important feature in the life of a non-profit is fundraising. It is always on our minds and part of every board meeting. We have the support of membership and the city, we held an auction, and we had the opportunity to participate in shop and share events with Whole Foods, Colonial Restaurant and Standard Market. We were also invited to host of ice cream social for one of the summer concerts at the band shell.

This is certainly not all that we accomplished; each of us who has volunteered on the board and on committees works with dedication and focus to protect and live out our mission and our responsibilities to our members and the community. As I move to the Director of Education position please know that I am still always available and welcome your involvement.

Thanks for your role in a successful Celebrate Art! fundraiser, April 24. The event was wellattended and brought in nearly \$1,000 for classroom renovations.

Celebrate Art! is the ongoing theme leading up to this year's Riverwalk Fine Art Fair. It's our 30th anniversary of organizing and hosting the spectacular event. Ads, promotions, and more will include the theme.

4th Fridays from now through September will include an artful door prize and/or silent auction item. This is all part of our 30th anniversary year celebration of the Riverwalk Fine Art Fair. Plan on attending the next 4th Friday on May 22.

Riverwalk Fine Art Fair update: jurying has taken place for the Sept. 19-20 art fair. The countdown has begun. Great news! Last year's art fair poster won Honorable Mention in Sunshine Artist magazine's national art fair poster competition. Past RFAF posters and street banners are available for sale through our Gallery.

The **Gallery** is currently full with 56 pieces of art inspired by the theme Renewal. While the Exhibit committee does its best to include all submitted art, here's a reminder from our Exhibit Rules: because Gallery space is limited, members, especially those submitting 2 large pieces, may have a piece refused due to lack of wall space. A full Gallery is a good problem to have, don't you think?

The **next member show** is themed Best Guess. This will be a 3-week show with awards presented at the May 22 Fourth Friday event, 7:00 to

9:00 pm.

June 11-14 People's Resource Center guest show will be in our Gallery, featuring work by PRC clients. Reception is on June 14 from 2:00 to 4:00 pm.. PRC brings neighbors together to respond to hunger and poverty, promote dignity and justice, and create a future of hope and opportunity for residents of DuPage County. Nearly 32,000 people rely on PRC for help each year. Over 2,000 volunteers help others connect with resources. One of many services, PRC's art program has helped clients learn skills that build self-confidence or generate income. The show will include work by PRC participants and volunteers who attend the Wheaton and Westmont locations. See paintings, drawings, mixed media pieces and ceramics. Some will be for sale with proceeds going directly to the artists. PRC will be accepting donations of new or slightly used art supplies at the event.
