**Art Donations:** A big THANK YOU to all the members who contributed to NAL's "Off the Street Club" art supply collection incentive. All the supplies were well received and will be used by the inner city students that belong to the organization.

AFA Best of the Best Show. The exhibit is on display at DuPage Art League through May 31 with an award ceremony on May 22, from 2:00 to 4:00 pm.

Silent Art Auction Fundraiser: The event raised approximately \$1,600 minus \$300 in expenses. Attendance was low but board members / NAL members purchased many art items.

**RFAF:** Jury was held last week –460 applications were reviewed and judged. Invitations for exhibitors and waitlisted artists will be sent out within the next few weeks.
