## \* PLEASE READ CAREFULLY\*

Sketchbook at least 5" X 7" 6B & 2B Pencil

If you already have oil paints, bring what you have and we will review them. *If you want to purchase a beginner type kit, that would be fine too*. If however, you intend to keep painting, buy artist grade not student grade paints. Artist grade are more expensive but last longer as there is more pigment in them.

These items are very important:

## Masking tape

Roll of paper towels (blue shop paper towels, Viva or Bounty)

Palette paper tablet 12X16 (NOT one with finger hole)

At least 6 canvas boards. Size range can be 9x12, or 11x14. Please, nothing smaller then 9x12 and should not to exceed 11x14. Mineral spirits (low odor or odorless paint thinner, can be purchased at hardware store)

\*\*Brush cleaning tank/jar or refer to bottom of page

Palette knife, approx. 2" trowel shaped blade #45 Italian Palette knife

Bristle brushes with Long handles:

#2, #4, #8 Flats & #2 Round

Liquin (this is a medium and drying agent) Liquin is a must so paintings dry faster.

## Minimum colors recommended:

Titanium White Alizarin Crimson Cadmium Red Light or Medium Cadmium Orange Cadmium Yellow Medium Viridian Green Ultramarine Blue

<sup>\*\*</sup>Three empty plastic 16oz water/soda bottles with caps. You will be shown how to use these in class as a substitute for turp. tank and for waste mineral spirits.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>To carry your wet painting home, a corrugated cardboard box top works very well.

<sup>\*\*\*</sup>Plastic grocery bag for your trash.
